SLIPS AND TRIPS (ACCOMMODATION) AND LESSONS LEARNED

Slips and Trips, usually leading to falls, are one of the leading causes of injury in work environments. In this document, lessons learned are discussed based on incident records of slips, and trips in the accommodation areas.

Category	Amount	Lessons Learned
Broken/Damaged Equipment	35	Broken and damaged equipment should be repaired
		Inspections should include checking for damage and broken equipment
		Maintenance must be done regularly on all equipment
Defective Design	8	Designs may need to be altered depending on placement of equipment
		Equipment should be redesigned if repeated problems have occurred
Missing Equipment	10	Inspections should be performed for missing equipment
Environmental Conditions	13	Surfaces may contain water or ice due to environmental conditions
		Weather conditions may cause the vessel to be unstable at times
Equipment Failure	3	Maintenance must be done regularly on all equipment
Inadequate Lighting	2	Adequate lighting should be provided in all areas

No three points of contact	34	Employees should maintain three points of contact at all times
		Employees should be aware of the proper safe climbing procedures
Not securing equipment	29	Equipment should be secured properly after use
Not using PPE	5	Employees must use proper PPE at all times
Situational Awareness	39	Employees should be aware of their environment at all times
Poor Housekeeping	30	Employees must be aware of the proper housekeeping tasks
		Employees must have the proper training before performing housekeeping tasks
Safety Device Missing	21	Safety devices must be in place
		Warning signs and safety devices must be put into place
		Check for safety devices when performing inspections
Wrong Equipment in Use	8	The proper equipment should be used at all times
		Employees should be aware of the proper equipment for each task
